Our Township is nestled between fertile farms and the Federal Pinelands Natural Reserve in Burlington County, New Jersey. Located 30 minutes from Philadelphia and 45 minutes from the Jersey Shore. A small town, cultural center for the region, with an open business friendly atmosphere.

Greetings from the Mayor

Welcome to Medford New Jersey!

Medford is an active modern community that has retained its small-town charm. Almost 25,000 residents enjoy a great quality of life that includes a safe and healthy environment, excellent schools, and first—rate recreational and cultural opportunities. Located on the fringe to the Pinelands National Reserve, a treasure trove of history and ecology await residents while living in close proximity to both the Jersey Shore and Philadelphia. Well over 5,000 acres of Medford's 41 square miles is permanently preserved open space and farmland, thus insuring a future without excessive suburban sprawl.

Historic Medford Village's quaint Main Street is the heartbeat of the Township, and is lined with unique gift shops, boutiques, restaurants, cafes and breweries, and Medford's Art Center; which attracts visitors from throughout the area. Other attractions, including Johnson's Corner Farm, historic Kirby's Mill, the Dr. James Still Education Center, Woodford Cedar Run Wildlife Refuge, the Air Victory Museum and South Jersey's only arboretum at Medford Leas. Our many parks offer walking, hiking, fishing and paddling, plus playgrounds, a skate park, a renowned dog park and athletic courts and ballfields galore.

Medford has a variety of special events virtually every month of the year. Standouts are the Apple Festival in October, the Dickens Festival in early December, the Halloween Parade, the Independence Day Celebration complete with a grand fireworks display, and the Art, Music & Wine Festival in June. Others include Country Day and the Quilt Show at Kirby's Mill, Autumn with the Animals at Cedar Run Refuge, fall hayrides and pumpkin picking at Johnson's Farm and a Holiday House Tour at Christmas time.

Medford is consistently ranked in the top 3 of South Jersey municipalities, and was the only town in New Jersey to be included in the National Geographic's *Guide to Small Town Escapes*. Perhaps National Geographic summed it up best: "Medford.... Pine garlands and twinkling white lights provide a Victorian touch to tiny Medford in early December, when the whole township crowds Main Street for the annual Dickens celebration. A cool, northerly wind sends aloft the sweet aroma of steaming apple cider and cinnamon, as bundled-up revelers, carolers, characters from a Christmas Carol, and musicians alike greet familiar faces, of which there are many. For that's the kind of place Medford is; a friendly tight knit community where everyone knows everyone."

Senior Information

The Medford Senior Center is located at 44 Charles Street in Cranberry Hall, (behind the Medford Municipal Building at 17 N. Main St). It is open daily from 9:00am to 4:00pm. The center celebrated its official grand opening on June 10, 2004. During the years, programs offered at the Senior Center have grown to include: bridge, pinochle, canasta, rummikub, Mexican Train, Mah Jong, knitting and crocheting, watercolor painting, a book club, an investment discussion group, a woman's discussion group, genealogy, a senior tennis



group, and travel and trips. Exercise programs such as: soft and gentle yoga and Project Healthy Bones offered weekly.

The Center is available for socializing and relaxing, meeting your neighbors, reading a book or magazine from the growing donor library or joining friends for a casual board or card game. We also feature guest speakers on pertinent subjects for Seniors.

Additionally, there are many regularly scheduled social activities being offered. Recent socials like trivia and bingo have been very well attended and thoroughly enjoyed by those participating. Every third Friday of the month there is a social which includes food and occasional entertainment. Fun and Game Night takes place every Friday night from 7:00 – 9:00pm. Once a month the seniors dine out at an area restaurant.

The Cranberry Hall Senior Center is always looking for suggestions of new activities to offer. It is here for the enjoyment and fellowship of Medford seniors, and both the Township and the volunteers of the center are making every effort to meet their needs.



Still Park

The Park was refurbished by the Township in 2018 and includes walking paths, benches, picnic area, a tot-lot playground area, and a reflection area and monument honoring Dr. Still. Memorial Day Parade & Ceremony — VFW Post #7677 and Medford Township sponsors this annual parade and ceremony at the Veteran's Memorial, held on Memorial Day.

Art, Wine & Music Festival on Main Street — The Medford Business Association and Medford Arts Center conducts this festival every year on the second Sunday of June.

Independence Day Celebration at Freedom Park — The Medford Celebrates Foundation hosts a Fourth of July fireworks party every year at Freedom Park in Medford on the eve of Independence Day.

Medford Oktoberfest Music & Food Truck Festival — Produced by the Medford Business Association, on the 3rd Saturday in September. The Medford Art, Wine & Music Festival features live music, food and craft beers is held every year on the 3rd Sunday in September at Freedom Park.

Halloween Parade — The Medford-Vincentown Rotary sponsors this parade down Main Street with hundreds of kids and floats on the last Saturday before Halloween.
