

## <u>DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS - UTILITIES DIVISION TO START</u> <u>FLUSHING PROGRAM IN JUNE</u>

Starting this month, you will notice fire hydrants being flushed and releasing large amounts of water into the streets. While it may appear that hundreds of gallons are going to waste, there are actually several benefits to this hydrant flushing process.

Water main flushing is an important preventative maintenance activity that:

- verifies proper operation of the hydrant
- evaluates the available flow to the hydrant
- allows the Utilities Division to deliver the highest quality water possible to residents as it removes mineral and sediment build up from the water mains

#### **During Flushing**

- 1. There may be a temporary drop in water pressure at this time.
- 2. Water may become cloudy, discolored water is not harmful and will clear up in a short time.
- 3. Run your bath tub/faucets on cold only if you experience discolored water, do not run any water until the cold water clears up.
- 4. Do not wash any white laundry while flushing is taking place.

The Utilities Division will be contacting HOA's when each neighborhood is scheduled. Updates on locations where flushing will be taking place will be posted on the Newsfeed of the Township website & on our official Facebook page.

If you experience discolored water for an extended period of time after flushing has been completed, please call the Department of Public Works at 609-654-6791.

The Police Department has noted several recent "smash-and-grab" vehicle break-ins, including in the Township's parks. Perpetrators are mostly casual opportunists —they see something they like, so they break in and take it.

These have occurred during daylight hours, so please be vigilant and follow these recommended tips.

Before leaving home, make sure your valuables are out of sight. Keep in mind that you may be watched while placing valuables in your trunk at your parking lot destination.

Never leave these things lying out on your seats, dashboard or floor:

- Phone
- Purse or wallet
- Laptop (or its bag)
- A briefcase or backpack
- Shopping bags
- Any small electronics
- CDs if you still use them
- Cash yes, even loose change/coins

#### 2023 BRUSH COLLECTION PROGRAM

Below are the collection dates for the annual DPW brush collection program:

#### Remainder of Spring Collection Schedule

Zone 4: Weeks of June 5th & 12th

#### Summer/Fall Collection

Zone 1: Weeks of August 14th & 21st

Zone 3: Weeks of August 28th & September 4th

Zone 5: Weeks of September 11th & 18th

Zone 4: Weeks of September 25th & October 2nd

Zone 2: Weeks of October 9th & 16th

The Public Works Department will alert the public via Nixle alerts and Face-

book posts as they complete each Zone &/or if they experience delays. Each street will be collected once. Township Code states "All brush shall be stored on a resident's property and shall not be placed at the roadside earlier than 10 days preceding the Monday of the scheduled collection week". Brush placed at the street for collection outside of these collection dates will not be picked up.

Brush shall include the pruning of trees, shrubs, bushes or vines, but exclude grass clippings, flowers, weeks, tree trunks, stumps and leaves. If the excluded items are mixed with the brush, the material will not be collected. All brush must be piled neatly at the edge of the property and cannot be placed in any roadway or sidewalk. Brush should not exceed 4-6 feet in length, and should not be any larger than 6 inches in diameter.

\*\*\*As a reminder for those residents who utilize a private contractor, the contractor is responsible for the removal of the brush from the property.

The Township Council proudly announces that Medford has received the following grants this calendar year, which will allow Medford officials to leverage municipal capital improvement funds and local budget monies to undertake several major improvement projects and service initiatives in the Township. Under the

direction of the Township Council, the administration and staff, working in close coordination with the Township's Engineer and Planners, work diligently throughout the year seeking and applying for federal, state, county and private funds to enhance Township operations and delivery of services.

#### <u>Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside Program Grant = \$1,486,000</u>

This highly competitive grant from the NJ Department of Transportation will allow Township officials to construct a Main Street north to south bicycle & pedestrian connector from Church & Wilkins Station Road along Main Street/County Route 541 through the Village to Chapel Avenue. Major streetscape improvements will also be included in the overall project as funded by this grant. Lighting enhancements will be taking place this summer with federal American Recovery Program (ARP) grant monies previously awarded to Medford Township.

#### Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant = \$200,000

The SS4A grant program supports the US Department of Transportation's National Roadway Safety Strategy and their goal of zero roadway deaths. This grant from the USDOT will allow Medford Township to develop a comprehensive Action Plan to address pedestrian & bicycling safety throughout the Township, especially since many roadways and neighborhoods were developed without sidewalks and/or wide shoulders.

#### **Community Development Block Grant =\$100,000**

This federal grant, as administered by the Burlington County Community Development Office, will allow Medford to construct Phase II of the Union Street & Allen Avenue barrier removal project, including handicapped curb cuts at all crosswalks and installation of new sidewalk along both streets.

#### **Local Recreational Improvement Grant = \$82,000**

This grant from the NJ Department of Community Affairs will allow Township officials to make repairs to the Freedom Park Skatepark and also make improvements to the auxiliary parking lot used for both the skatepark and the new pickleball courts.

#### NJ Department of Transportation Local Aid Grant (FY 2023) = \$316,870

This grant will fund Phase II of the Eayrestown Road rehabilitation project, including drainage and stormwater management improvements. When ultimately completed, the entire length of Eayrestown Road from the Medford border to Route 70 will be reconstructed.

#### NJ Clean Communities Grant = \$78,698.25

This grant from the NJ Clean Communities Council funds litter removal programs that beautify communities, improves water quality, reduces localized flooding, and protects natural habitats.

#### Federal American Recovery Program Grant = \$43,000

As administered by the NJ State Division of Local Government Services, this grant enabled the Fire & EMS Department to purchase personal protective gear for their staff and volunteers.
