2023 SPRING BRUSH COLLECTION PROGRAM

Below are the collection dates for the annual spring brush collection: <u>Remainder of Spring Collection Schedule</u> Zone 1: Week of May 1st Zone 3: Weeks of May 8th & 15th Zone 5: Weeks of May 22nd & 29th Zone 4: Weeks of June 5th & 12th

Summer/Fall Collection Zone 1: Weeks of August 14th & 21st Zone 3: Weeks of August 28th & September 4th Zone 5: Weeks of September 11th & 18th Zone 4: Weeks of September 25th & October 2nd Zone 2: Weeks of October 9th & 16th



The Public Works Department will alert the public via Nixle alerts and Facebook posts as they complete each Zone &/or if they experience delays. Each street will be collected once. Township Code states "All brush shall be stored on a resident's property and shall not be placed at the roadside earlier than 10 days preceding the Monday of the scheduled collection week". Brush placed at the street for collection outside of these collection dates will not be picked up.

Brush shall include the pruning of trees, shrubs, bushes or vines, but exclude grass clippings, flowers, weeks, tree trunks, stumps and leaves. If the excluded items are mixed with the brush, the material will not be collected. All brush must be piled neatly at the edge of the property and cannot be placed in any roadway or sidewalk. Brush should not exceed 4-6 feet in length, and should not be any larger than 6 inches in diameter.



HUNTING PROHIBITED ON ALL TOWNSHIP PROPERTY

Per The Township's Administrative Code #109-3 (Parks & Playgrounds), it is prohibited to "hold, posses, or use any firearm or weapon in or within 300 feet of any park, playground or open space area," and "molest, trap, capture or hunt, remove, injure or kill any animal or disturb its habitat, except in portions of any park or open space area designated as open for fishing." Township property has been posted and hunting restrictions will be enforced.

TROUT SEASON IS NOW OPEN!

Anglers of all ages can now head to their favorite fishing spots as of last month.

The Pequest Trout Hatchery has stocked New Jersey waterways with more than 180,000 rainbow trout. This includes the southwest branch of the Rancocas Creek in Medford. Public fishing access is available in Medford Park (entrances off of Mill Street and Gill Road/Allen Avenue), in Tomlinson Park at the corner of South Main

Street & Allen Avenue, along the Creek from South Main Street to Branch Street (no vehicles on the trail please!), and at Kirby's Mill on Church Road.

Anyone aged 16 or older must obtain a New Jersey fishing license and trout stamp to fish for trout. For more info, visit: https://dep.nj.gov/njfw/fishing/freshwater/buy-a-license/.

PICKLEBALL COURTS ALMOST COMPLETED!

The four new pickleball courts are almost complete in Freedom Park! The final painting of the Courts and installation of the nets is all that remains until the grand opening!

The need for pickleball courts was expressed in several public hearings when the Township's Recreation & Open Space Master Plan was being developed and adopted in 2019. In response, the Township Council budgeted capital improvement project funds to construct the courts, which are located near the skatepark and community garden area of Freedom Park.

Once the courts have been officially opened, reservations can be made via the **"Team Reach**©" app. Sports Paradise, located at 99 Hartford Road, has graciously volunteered to help manage this app for the Township as we open the courts.

There will be designated times set aside for beginners, intermediates, and advanced players. Time will also be set aside for a seniors instructional program operated under the auspices of the Cranberry Hall Senior Center. When the opening of the Courts is announced, the schedule will be posted on the homepage of the Township website.

Open play is built into the schedule, and given the anticipated demand, we ask that the common pickleball courtesies be extended to waiting players. Click <u>HERE</u> for the Rules & Court Use Etiquette.

E-mobility devices make it easier to:

- Save on gas, parking, and rideshare costs.
- Access destinations without needing to walk or drive.
- Reduce carbon emissions.
- Make "first-mile" and "last-mile" connections for bus and train trips.
- Climb hills and keep up with traffic without getting sweaty.
- Help people with limitations due to age, physical fitness levels, or disabilities.



* Restrictions may vary by agency. PATH and NJT restrict non-collapsible vehicles during peak travel times. Bus racks have limited availability and may not fit all bikes.

Low-speed e-bikes and e-scooters are regulated like bicycles. Drivers of low-speed e-bikes and e-scooters:

- Must ride in the same direction as traffic and obey all traffic lights, signs, and signals.
- Are advised to wear helmets to minimize potential head injury. Helmets are required in NJ for youth under age 17.
- Must park devices without blocking pedestrian and/or wheelchair access.
- Should not ride on sidewalks. Off-road trails generally do not allow motorized bicycles, but may allow e-bikes and e-scooters. Regulations vary by municipality and county. Check all local ordinances and policies. Ride slowly in areas with pedestrians.

2023 MEMORIAL DAY OBSERVANCES PROGRAMS OFFERED ON SATURDAY, MAY 27TH AND MONDAY, MAY 29TH

The Township Council & Medford VFW Post #7677 are pleased to announce that they will hold Medford's Annual Memorial Day Parade & Observances on **Monday, May 29th**, beginning at 11:00 a.m.

As a reminder, as of 2019 the Parade route has changed. The Parade will now start at Allen School on Allen Avenue near Union Street, and proceed east to South Main Street. The Parade will turn left onto South Main Street; stopping briefly at the War Memorials adjacent to the Medford Memorial Community Center at 26 South Main Street to raise the flag, present a wreath and offer a 21-gun salute. The Parade will then re-start and continue north, turning left on Union Street. The Parade concludes in Freedom Park at 86 Union Street. The ceremony will start immediately at the conclusion of the Parade in Freedom Park.

Parade participants will include members of the VFW Post #7677, the Shawnee High School Marching Band, the Medford Police Department, Medford EMS, the Union & Taunton Fire Companies, the Nam Knights, the Civil Air Patrol-Air Victory Museum Composite Squadron. Medford Masonic Lodge #178, the Warrior Watch Riders, as well as many other public safety representatives and military re-enactment associations from neighboring communities.

This year's Grand Marshall is William (Bill) J. Dorman. He served in the US Air Force for 13 years from 1947-1960 as a Platoon Sergeant, Management Instructor, and Management Consultant in the US, Okinawa and Alaska; including the Air Defense Command/NORAD at Ent AFB in Colorado Springs. After his service concluded, Sgt. Dorman also developed strategic plans, product and business opportunities while employed at Bausch and Lomb Scientific Instrument Division in Rochester and the ITEK Corporation of Rochester and Boston, MA. Bill then went on to Found the Dorman Management Consulting firm in the mid-1960's. He has traveled extensively throughout the US, Europe, Norway and Brazil assisting Fortune 1000 clients in developing new business and products. Upon retirement, he was an Adjunct Professor at the Wharton Business School for five years. He has also developed and led adult discussions about Emotional Intelligence for six years, and remained active in community service with his Church, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Music, Baseball, Ice Hockey and Golf throughout his life.

The Township Council invites and encourages Veterans to march in the Parade or join them in a vehicle. Local Scout troops and civic organizations who wish to march in the parade are also encouraged to do so and should contact the Beth Portocalis at the Municipal Offices

(bportocalis@medfordtownship.com) or by calling 609-654-2608 x330. Also, participation in the parade on decorated bicycles is highly encouraged. Bikers should report to the Allen School staging area by 10:45 a.m., and must wear safety helmets.

Preceding the Memorial Day observances, on **Saturday, May 27th**, VFW Post #7677 is planning to perform memorial services at each of the three Medford Township cemeteries east of Main Street (Family Ministry at Branch and Filbert Streets, the Baptist Cemetery and the Odd Fellows Cemetery) in the usual sequence, commencing at noon. The small gated cemetery on Stokes Road @ Himmelein Road is also included. Accordingly, the Parade route on Monday will not include stops



FIELD OF HONOR RETURNING TO FREEDOM PARK THE WEEK OF MEMORIAL DAY

On Friday, May 26, 2023, Rotarians and community volunteers will erect over 325 full-size American flags on 7.5' flag poles in Freedom Park—in perfectly symmetrical rows. Medallions will be placed on flags with details of the nominated "heroes." The Field of Honor® will remain for a full week, from May 26 through June 4, 2023.

The water wheel will be turning the millstones making cornmeal. Visitors can tour the historic Kirby's Mill housing the Society's museum collection. The Blacksmith Shop will be open with Rick Young at the forge. The Barn will be open for viewing the farm museum exhibits. The Society's collection of wagons and buggies will be on display in the Wagon Shed. Historic crafters at work include broom maker, Sam Moyer, basketmaker, Gretchen Birdsall along with others. Antique machines will be on display and working. Members of the SJ Guild of Spinners and Weavers will apply their craft on an antique loom. Other demonstrations include the big wheel lathe in the Cabinetmaker Shop. Young people can be an "apprentice" turning the big wheel or working the morticing machine in the Carpenter Shop. Black powder rifle demonstrations and presentation of Civil War camp life will be featured by members of the 12th NJ Volunteer Infantry. MEDFORD TOWNSHIP'S OPEN SPACE & FARMLAND PRESERVATION PROGRAM

Since 1990, over 3,300 acres of parks & open space and almost 2,400 acres of farmland have been permanently preserved in Medford.

The Township Council has leveraged a combination of State Green Acres Funds, State Farmland Preservation Funds, County Open Space funds and County Farmland Preservation funds with the Township's Open Space tax in order to determinedly preserve these areas as deedrestricted farms or open space in perpetuity.

The Township Council has also willingly partnered with non-profits such

as the Rancocas Conservancy, Woodford Cedar Run Wildlife Refuge, and other land preservation entities iincluding the NJDEP Division of Parks & Forestry in their efforts to preserve open space and farmland, either through outright purchase or the purchase of development rights.

In addition, since the release of the renowned McHarg Study of Medford and the introduction of the Pinelands Natural Reserve in 1980, all of the residential developments in Medford were approved with significant dedicated open space areas, meaning they cannot be developed in the future for additional housing. The chart below was taken from the Township's Recreation & Open Space Element to our Master Plan, adopted in 2021 by the Township Council and the Planning Board, and outlines that over 44% of Medford is permanently preserved!! .
