BRUSH COLLECTION

Township officials announced in June that Brush will be collected on a monthly basis. This trial program will run through December, 2023. The collection program will follow the monthly schedule below for the remainder of the year:

December, 2023:

Week of 12/4 - Zones 1 and 2 will be collected

Week of 12/11 – Zone 3 will be collected

Week of 12/18 - Zone 4 will be collected

Week of 12/25 - Zone 5 will be collected

Requirements for brush collection will remain the same. All brush must be placed at the street no earlier than ten (10) days before a scheduled collection. In the fall months, brush and leaves must be separated.

Brush must be at the street by 6 am on the Monday of the scheduled collection week. Each street will be collected once.

The 2023 annual Fall Leaf Collection program began the week of November 6th.

The remaining schedule is as follows: Zones 1 & 2: Week of December 4th Zone 5: Week of December 11th Zone 3: Week of December 18th Zone 4: Week of December 25th

Medford Township purchased two new leaf collection vehicles in 2022 that should greatly enhance leaf collection efforts. These vehicles will help complete collections quicker and easier. These trucks are self-contained units and only require one person to operate. This will reduce dump times and will increase the number of loads that can be disposed of during a regular work day. Please note that using these vehicles will require residents to follow strict collection guidelines.


Crews will collect each street once during the collection week. Leaves MUST be curbside by Monday morning of the scheduled collection week. Placing leaves at the street after the truck has passed will result in leaves not being collected until the next scheduled collection week.

Residents are encouraged to build enclosures out of four (4) foot vinyl construction fencing available at local home improvement stores. These enclosures should be placed parallel to the roadway and should be no further than ten (10) feet from the edge of the roadway. PLEASE NOTE THAT TRUCKS WILL NOT LEAVE THE ROADWAY FOR ANY REASON TO COLLECT LEAVES. Drivers will

ANY REASON TO COLLECT LEAVES. Drivers will stay on the roadway to prevent damage to any private property and reduce the chance of getting stuck.

Leaves must be free of sticks, branches, tree parts, rocks, vines, or other foreign materials. These items will clog the suction tube resulting in increased down time and possible delays. Leaf piles that include any of these items WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.

Any leaves placed at the street by landscapers, contractors, or anyone hired by a homeowner, must be removed by them. Township crews will record addresses where landscapers are actively working and any leaves placed at the street will not be collected by Township personnel.





HOLIDAY OPERATIONAL SCHEDULES

Township Offices and the Township Garage/DPW Yard will be closed on both Monday, December 25th and Monday, January 1st, 2024.

Trash Collection will be delayed by one day on both weeks; i.e. Monday's trash collected on Tuesday, Tuesday's trash collection on Wednesday, etc.

ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

The Council awarded a contract in November to improve (paving & drainage) all or portions of the following roads: White Pine Drive, Evergreen Trail, White Birch Trail, Mulberry Street, South Street, Church Street and portions of McKendimen Road.

It is anticipated that drainage work will take place over the winter, and paving work will start in the spring of 2024. Residents of affected streets will be given advance notice by the contractor as to when the paving work will take place.



The Council will also be utilizing over \$325,000 in NJDOT grant funds for drainage improvements and roadway paving of Eayrestown Road from Church Road to Route 70, completing Phase II of the overall project.

SNOW REMOVAL HELP NEEDED

The Township is currently accepting applications for part-time or per diem snow removal personnel. Personnel should have a valid NJ Drivers License and have a demonstrated ability to operate snow removal equipment including snowplows, snow blowers, snow shovels, etc. Applicants should be able to lift 50 pounds and pass a background check and drug screening.

STATE OFFERING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE WITH UTILITY BILLS

The Department of Community Affairs in the State of NJ has implemented a Winter Termination Program to prevent service discontinuation and provide aide for eligible residential customers.

This Winter Termination Program is intended to prevent utility shutoffs between November 15 through March 15 for eligible residential customers receiving residential electric, gas, sewer and water service from a local authority, municipal utility, investor- owned utility, or rural electric cooperative.

SAFE DISPOSAL OF ASHES FROM FIREPLACES & WOOD BURNING STOVES

The Dept. of Fire & EMS is reminding residents to properly dispose of fireplace ashes. Improper ash disposal from indoor & outdoor fireplaces, wood burning stoves and charcoal grills cause thousands of fires every year nationally. Fires can also occur in trash carts and trash trucks. Many people don't realize the length of time required for ashes to cool enough for disposal. Four days/96 hours is the minimum cooling period for ashes. And even after several days a pile of ashes can hold enough heat to reignite and start a fire. Accordingly, we are asking residents to follow safe disposal practices in order to keep property and trash truck drivers safe.

Recommendations include:

- Cool ashes for several days in the chimney or fireplace. Use a fireplace screen to stop sparks from flying.
- After ashes are cooled, put them in a fire resistant metal container with a closed, tight-fitting lid placed away from anything that can burn. You can also soak them in water. After sitting for a week, the ashes are safe to dispose of in your trash container but never in the recycling or green waste cart. Heavy duty aluminum foil can be used to wrap cooled or soaked ashes.
- Never put ashes in plastic, cardboard, paper or wood containers, or use a vacuum cleaner to pick up ashes.



TOWNSHIP MANAGER & CLERK KATHY BURGER RETIRES AFTER 36 YEARS

Katherine "Kathy" Burger has been an employee of the Township of Medford since October of 1987, starting as a Cashier in the Tax Office. She was subsequently transferred to the Finance Office in June of 1988 where she rose through the ranks, and after obtaining her Certified Municipal Finance Officer Certification from the Rutgers Center for Local Government Services was appointed as Chief Municipal Finance Officer in 2005, serving in this capacity until August of 2015.

During ceremonies on November 21st, the Township Council, the Police Department and the Fire & EMS Department, on behalf of all Township employees and residents, expressed their appreciation and heartfelt gratitude to Kathy for the integrity, professionalism, enthusiasm and resourcefulness she brought to Medford Township throughout her 36 years of employment.


